SUBJECT: FY 2017-18 MID-YEAR BUDGET ADJUSTMENT

#### **BACKGROUND**

On June 6, 2017, the Board of the Big Bear Fire Authority approved the Operating Budget for FY 2017-18. Since that time, the Fire Authority has engaged in a contract with Air Methods to provide staffing and facility use in support of air ambulance services for the Big Bear community. The increase in full-time employees (FTE) by two Flight Paramedic positions was approved by the FA Board at their regular meeting on December 18, 2017.

Second, administrative staff has developed a Request for Proposal (RFP) for consulting services related to seeking additional funding from the Big Bear Community to fund improved fire and emergency services in the Big Bear Valley. The RFP is being presented for Board approval at today's, January 29, 2018, special meeting.

#### **DISCUSSION**

The FY 2017-18 Air Ambulance Budget (Exhibit A) includes staffing expenses of approximately \$65,000 and support expenses of approximately \$35,000 as outlined in the Air Methods contract. Revenues of approximately \$165,000 support the total expenses of \$100,000.

The response to the RFP for consulting services related to seeking additional funding for fire and emergency services is expected to come back with large upfront expenses that could be up to \$80,000 before fiscal year-end, June 30, 2018.

This proposed budget adjustment was presented to the Fire Authority Administrative Committee on January 17, 2018, for their consideration.

#### **RECOMMENDATION**

1. Staff recommends a budget adjustment to the FY 2017-18 Big Bear Fire Authority Operating Budget of \$165,000 increase in revenues and \$100,000 increase in expenses is

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recommended by staff to support the Air Methods contract in FY 2017-18. Exhibit A also presents the FY 2018-19 draft budget for the Air Methods contract.

2. Staff recommends a budget adjustment of an \$80,000 increase in Professional Services expenses in FY 2017-18 Big Bear Fire Authority operating budget to anticipate contracting for consulting services related to seeking additional funding for improved Fire and Emergency services in the Big Bear Valley.

#### **BACKGROUND**

At the August 23, 2016, Fire Authority Board meeting, the Board authorized the development of a Fire Protection Master Plan for the Department. The purpose of developing the Master Plan was to:

- Provide information about current response and service levels
- Identify decision points requiring changes in service levels
- Identify projected cost and potential funding sources to pay for desired service levels
- Identify indicators involving population growth, number of responses, response reliability, resource distribution, incident specific responses, and other factors that provide trigger points for consideration of increasing coverage areas and service levels

The Fire Protection Master plan was developed by Matrix Consulting Group over the course of a one-year period with the final report and presentation being received by the Board at its August 1, 2017 Board meeting. Within the Fire Protection Master Plan there are a number of key findings and associated recommendations

#### **DISCUSSION**

Among the recommendations within the Master Plan, there are several that require additional revenue in order to be accomplished. The Department is now in the process of developing a strategic plan to address the Master Plan recommendations. The Board has indicated their desire to seek consulting services to assist with future funding options that may be available, determine level of community support, and provide other technical or analytical assistance that may be required.

The proposed Request for Proposals for consulting services (Exhibit A) was presented to the Fire Authority Strategic Planning Ad Hoc Committee on December 18, 2017 and again on January

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23, 2018, for their consideration, input, and discussion. Staff was directed by the Ad Hoc Committee to place this item on the Board's agenda for discussion and possible Board action

#### **RECOMMENDATION**

Staff recommends the Board authorize Staff to issue a Request for Proposals for consulting services to assist the Fire Authority in potential preparation of a ballot measure, community outreach, and accompanying activities to implement and fund the Fire Protection Master plan recommendations.

# CONSULTANT SERVICES REQUEST FOR PROPOSAL SPECIAL TAX BALLOT MEASURE, JUNE 2019

The Big Bear Fire Authority, hereafter referred to as the "Fire Authority" is inviting proposals to provide consulting services to assist the Fire Authority in preparing for a ballot measure to go before the voters in June 2019. The Fire Authority is looking for services to include:

- 1. Fire Department Structure/Tax Base
- 2. Public Opinion Research Polling
- 3. Communications/Public Education Strategy
- 4. Function as the Project Technical Specialist and advisor in support of the Fire Authority's revenue measure planning from start to finish

## The Fire Authority

The Fire Authority is in Southern California in an area locally referred to as the Big Bear Valley. The Big Bear Valley is located 100 miles east of Los Angeles in the San Bernardino mountains at an elevation of approximately 7,000 ft. It consists of the City of Big Bear Lake and several unincorporated communities in the County of San Bernardino that reside within Big Bear Valley

The Fire Authority is a Joint Powers Authority between Big Bear Lake Fire Protection District and Big Bear City Community Services District and serves the City of Big Bear Lake and surrounding unincorporated County areas of Big Bear City, Sugarloaf, Baldwin Lake Erwin Lake and Lake Williams This geographic region covers 256 square miles which covers the State Highway transportation corridors and the ambulance operating area. The community covered has a population of over 25,000 residents. The Fire Authority is governed by a ten-member appointed Board of Directors. The Fire Authority is an all risk department providing fire suppression, rescue, ambulance service, emergency medical paramedic services and community risk reduction through four full-time staffed fire stations who respond to about 5,000 incidents annually.

#### **Ballot Measure**

The Fire Authority has recently completed a Fire Protection Master Plan. The Fire Protection Master Plan identified a high occurrence of concurrent emergency call

volume affecting system reliability, along with emergency vehicle travel time exceeding 11 minutes to high priority calls. The Fire Protection Master Plan also identified fire demand zone that are underserved in combination with a recommendation to increase daily staffing on (2) Type I fire engines.

The Fire Authority is seeking to increase revenue to offset current operating deficit as well as additional revenue to make system improvement as recommended within the Fire Protection Master Plan

The Fire Authority is ready to move forward and bring a tax measure before the voters and is seeking to receive professional consultant services to improve our chance of success.

Please bid on the following tasks and include the range of fees associated with each.

#### Fire Department Structure/Tax Base

Big Bear Fire Authority currently receives 100% of its operating revenue as a pass through from its member agencies. The primary sources of revenue come from three sources: ad valorem property tax, 65%; fire protection parcel tax, 17%; and ambulance transport revenue, 18%.

## **Public Opinion Research and Survey**

Recommend wording and conduct **mail** and/or phone **survey to** registered voters to accurately identify voter support to improve emergency response system reliability and acceptable tax increase threshold to support the desired system improvements

Interpret and report results to the Fire Authority along with recommendations for next steps.

# **Assistance with Special Tax Election**

Assist with the preparation of the draft resolution, ballot question, full ballot text and election materials. Function as project technical specialist and advisor in support of the Fire Authority's efforts to gain voter support for a ballot measure.

### **Information Outreach**

Assist the Fire Authority with public informational outreach strategies and voter informational services, including question and answer documents, informational handouts, and other materials.

Guide Fire Authority staff in contacting or responding to voters on the proposed tax measure.

## Other Provisions to be Specified

Incidental costs incurred for the purchase of voter and property data, maps, travel, and other out-of-pocket expenses.
